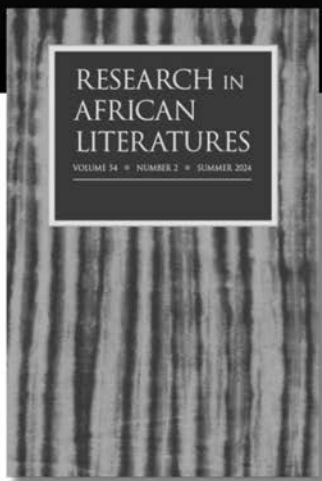


RESEARCH IN AFRICAN LITERATURES

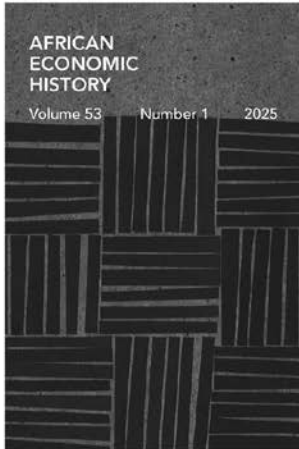

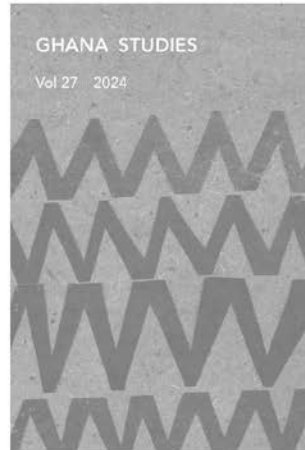
African Economic History
